

NCHS-INITIATED COMMUNITY BENEFIT PARTNERSHIP GRANTS

Every three years, NCHS and River Bend Hospital commission a community health needs assessment to identify the most critical health needs in the communities they serve. This assessment guides the development of an implementation plan for NCHS community benefit grantmaking. NCHS then solicits partnerships with coalitions, funders, nonprofits, and other entities to directly address community needs identified by the River Bend Hospital Community Health Needs Assessment and other NCHS-initiated needs assessments. Beyond the NCHS capital grants program, these NCHS-initiated community benefit funding partnerships launch, expand, or strengthen programs and services that improve health outcomes and develop healthy communities.


COMMUNITY BENEFIT SERVICES

Purdue University Center for Community Health Enhancement and Learning (HEAL) Academic Community Partnerships(ACP)

Purdue University's Center for Community Health Enhancement and Learning (HEAL) received funding from North Central Health Services (NCHS) on February 1, 2024. The goal of this funding is to assist local health departments with the implementation of the Health First Indiana initiative. This initiative is enacted by Senate Enrolled Act 4, legislation passed by the 2023 Indiana General Assembly to transform the public health infrastructure and landscape across Indiana. HEAL's role is to support the 8-county region by providing community capacity building, technical assistance, data and evaluation support, and training and education. This initiative targets the populations of the following Indiana counties: Benton, Carroll, Clinton, Fountain, Montgomery, Tippecanoe, Warren, and White.
